

OCDP Treatment Committee  
April 4, 2014  
Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 1:00pm at Talbot Hall.

The committee welcomed new member Max Cortes.

The committee reviewed and approved minutes from the 12/2/13 meeting.

A. Ferguson gave an update on the status of the committees work plan tasks as follows:

- Gambling Endorsement Legislation: Currently in the House under HB483. The language to include other license types as eligible to receive the endorsement will be removed per the request of the other licensing boards.
- Reciprocity Loophole Revisions: The Board approved the committees recommended changes at the 2/7/14 Board meeting and the changes have been implemented.
- Veterans Rules: The rules have passed the Common Sense Initiative process and will now be submitted to JCARR.
- ICRC AADC Credential: This credential no longer has a supervision component to it and therefore is not a viable option to replace the CCS credential if eliminated by ICRC. A. Ferguson will continue to monitor this at the ICRC level.
- Education Committee: The Committee re-launched and the education tasks in the Treatment Committee's work plan have been moved to the Education Committee's work plan.

The Committee determined that it would like to tackle the Supervision tasks identified on their work plan at the next meeting. A. Moss and A. Ferguson will lead that discussion.

The Committee discussed a recent Master's Accreditation Application from Grand Canyon University. A. Ferguson, D. Fidelibus and R. Yurisko conducted a virtual site visit on 3/6/14 and will be recommending accreditation to the full board at the May meeting. Future accreditation application will be reviewed by the Education Committee.

The Committee reviewed the FY2013 Credentialing Report. Members asked that future reports include total credentialing numbers, information on credentials that are being upgraded, information on CDCA's who are not advancing, information on pass rates for 2<sup>nd</sup> attempts if available. The committee asked to review this report on an annual basis.

The Committee discussed public comment received at the 2/7/14 Board Meeting and referred to the committee regarding reimbursement concerns. A. Ferguson shared that

SB232 just passed which authorizes LICDCs to be recognized by insurance panels. The committee asked for clarity on why the bill only spoke about alcoholism and not drug addiction. They also asked if lower level credentials could practice under an LICDC for insurance purposes. A. Ferguson stated she would try to find the answers to these.

A. Ferguson shared with the committee that the Board has been approached to house licenses for music and art therapists. This matter will be discussed at the next Executive Committee Meeting. The committee shared several questions they would like to have answered as the Executive Committee reviews this matter.

Lastly the Committee rescheduled meeting dates for 2014 as May 30, Sept 19 and Dec 5. All will be held at 1:00pm in Columbus.
