

OCDP Treatment Committee  
May 30, 2014  
Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 1:00pm at Talbot Hall.

The committee reviewed and approved (B. Jones, M. Cortes) minutes from the 4/4/14 meeting.

The committee reviewed a recent public comment received from Mr. Sylvanus Baddoo. The committee had a broad discussion of the matter. L. Criss suggested the Board work on marketing the value of the LICDC. A. Moss further suggested it might be beneficial to obtain data on employer attitudes regarding the LICDC.

A. Ferguson gave an update on the status of the committees work plan tasks as follows:

- Gambling Endorsement Legislation: Has passed both the House and Senate and is now in Conference Committee to work out the final version. Expect to pass by end of June.
- Veterans Rules: Public Hearing was held with no comment. Rules will now go to JCARR and should take effect in early July.
- ICRC Legislative Revisions: Rep Sprague has agreed to sponsor and LSC has completed draft language. A. Ferguson is meeting with Rep Sprague next week to talk through timing.
- DSM 5 & ICD10: Hope to have Brad provide an update at the next meeting.

A. Moss led the committee in a discussion of clinical supervision. The committee reviewed what other states are doing related to clinical supervision. The committee discussed the possibility of establishing a process for CDCAs to register their supervisors with the Board. They further discussed incorporating supervision questions into the renewal application and randomly auditing supervisees/supervisors. The committee discussed created clinical supervision recommendations to include frequency, sample supervision contracts, and definitions of supervision. The committee discussed the creation of an ethics webinar that CDCAs could be required to take.

The committee further reviewed two surveys to go out to supervisors/supervisees regarding their experience with clinical supervision. A. Moss and A. Ferguson will work on finalizing the survey and adding an introductory statement explaining the intent of the survey. They will try to have survey results available for the next committee meeting.

The committee discussed agenda items for the next meeting. They will continue their review of clinical supervision and will also discuss a new retesting policy established by

ICRC. The committee briefly discussed the CSW Board's retest policy and A. Ferguson will obtain further information on this to aid in the discussion at the next meeting.

A. Ferguson shared that the Executive Committee is looking at authorizing a treatment and prevention professional to attend ICRC annual meetings if the budget permits the travel expenses.
